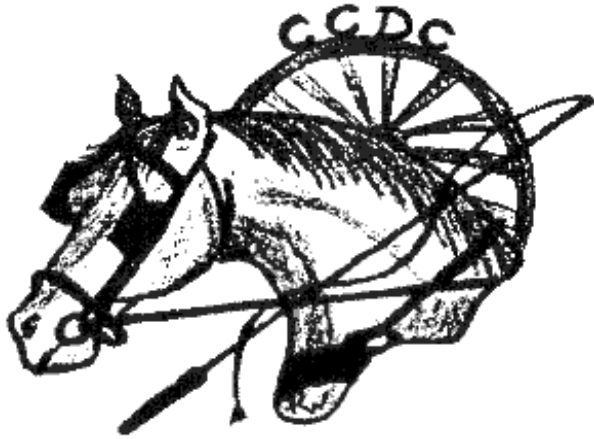

President's Message: Now Hear This!

Spring is here!.....get your gear clean and get everyone in shape for another season of competitive driving, pleasure driving, or just plain having 'fun'.

If you participated in other events as well....please email me and let me know so the membership will be informed!

It's Spring! Everything is getting green. Lots more opportunity to ride and drive before it gets too hot!

On behalf of CCDC I applied for and received a "Special Use Permit" to allow carriage driving at Umstead Park! The trails there are smooth and wide so they are great for carriages. If you haven't ever ridden on the trails, you may want to ride there first (or go with someone who knows the trails) since a few of the bridges are a little narrow. Your carriage will fit but since you can drive for miles without the risk, you may want to avoid those areas. The park has a nice trailer parking area complete with drinking water for horses and people, restrooms and picnic tables. After heavy rain the parking area may be muddy. Call ahead to make sure it is ok. There are some rules! Please follow them so we can enjoy this resource.

1. Monday - Thursday only! The trails are heavily used by bikes, walkers, baby strollers, runners, riders etc on the weekends.
2. Call a day ahead to arrange for a ranger to meet you to unlock the gate. Riders can follow the trail around the gate but the gate must be opened to let carriages in.
3. Stop at the visitors center to sign in and let them know you are ready for the gate to be opened.
4. ALL HORSES ENTERING THE PARK MUST HAVE A NEGATIVE COGGINS and show it at the visitors center. They will make a copy and keep it on file. After the first time your name will be in the computer so check-in goes pretty fast.
- 5 Single horses only. Vehicles less than 6 feet wide.
6. Use only designated Bike and Bridle trails. Hiking trails are off limits.
7. Horses at the park should be reasonably accustomed to bikes, dogs on leashes and baby strollers!

ADS members who enjoy recreational driving will be able to earn recognition for time spent in its pursuit, with the start of the ADS Hours to Drive Program which began April 1, 2008. The program, which will operate on the honor system, is designed to be a simplified version of the old ADS “miles program” for recreational drivers. You drive your horse or pony and write down the number of hours, on the log sheet spent on the box seat that day.

Drivers can earn an “Awards Pin” for 100 hours, 250 hours, 500 hours, 750 hours and 1000 hours of cumulative driving, by completing a log form. Logs must be returned before November 30, so we can report on members who have reached a milestone in the Whip and on the Web site.

Youth can earn credit towards an end of the year [Youth Recreational Championship](#) award.

CCDC show - Fall Classic Carriage and Pony Show ! Our Show!

We've got a date for the CCDC show - August 6 and 7 at the horse complex in Raleigh. Like last year we'll be joining forces with the Welsh Pony folks. Unlike last year, we'll have all of the classes in 2 days instead of 3. That will keep costs down considerably. We hope to get one judge to do all of the classes - another cost savings. There will be carriage classes for single horses, single ponies, juniors, and Welsh. There will be conformation and performance classes for Welsh ponies and Cobs and Mountain and Moorland Breeds. A prizelist will follow later in the summer.

The past 2 years we've offered carriage classes for non-trotting breeds. Nobody has ever entered although throughout the year folks request them. Since the prize list must be compressed I propose to leave these classes out unless the non-trotting folks actually promise to come! Feature Breed of the Month: Arabo-Friesians

"Arabo-Friesians are not just simple crosses between Friesians and Arabians. They should carry around 10% selected desert Arabian blood and look like pure Friesians, with slightly less fetlock hair and finer heads. They have smooth gaits and enjoy moving. They have great endurance and toughness and are thus suitable for the toughest sport competitions. One of the most important aspects is their disposition: it is the "golden character" of the old, proven Friesian bloodlines."

Did you know?....

There are a total of thirteen (13) pairs of muscles controlling the position of each ear, and a further ten pairs moving the nostrils, mouth, and lips-these muscles enable the horse to be very expressive and help the owner to "read" its moods and feelings.
